

Alaska Gun Collectors Association, Inc  
General Membership Meeting Minutes  
22 April 2007

1. The meeting was called to order upon determination of a quorum.

2. The minutes from the October 2007 show were not available.

3. Robert Hall delivered the treasurer's report: \$7,270.00 in the general account, \$6,560.00 in the Youth Day account, and \$14,000.00 in CDs. The Alaska Youth Shooting Sports organization donated \$21,000 for Youth Day. The report was accepted by unanimous consent, but for the BPMNV.<sup>1</sup>

4. Old business:

a. Garry Lodoen reported on gun show business. We will have three shows in 2007, since took on the summer show held at the Sullivan Arena and previously run by the Alaska Territorial Cavalry (Motorized). This gets us back to a show in Anchorage. We will have a banquet in conjunction with the summer show. We have shirts, jackets and other items for sale from the 35<sup>th</sup> club anniversary celebration. We have now purchased 120 new tables. We sold the two old trucks we had used to store tables, and we bought a new trailer to replace them. We need more participation from members. Garry thanked the volunteers, and introduced Paul and Jeanne Palinski, Hartley and Natasha Meyer, Robert Hall, and Wayne and Barbara Ross.

b. Youth Day is on track, and will be the same as it has been for 19 years. We need volunteers. This year, the date is 7 June. Visit the Youth Day table—we are raffling two rifles to raise funds. John Satterwhite will again perform his tricks with a shotgun.

5. New business:

a. There was a question about why we can't have guns and ammunition of the same calibers on the same table. The ban exists for safety reasons, and there are insurance considerations. There was much discussion.

b. Future gun shows: There are no 2008 dates yet, but the summer 2009 show will be on 1-2 August, with set-up on 31 July. This will be in conjunction with the NRA Gun Collectors Seminar that NRA decided would be in Alaska in 2009. We are negotiating with the Sullivan Arena for arrangements, and there will be a banquet in addition to other activities that are yet to be planned. The seminar offers a chance to chance to meet collectors from Outside. See Wayne Ross if you can help in any way.

c. We now are accepting ads for the newsletter. These will be small, and will cost \$10 per issue. The newsletter is now quarterly, and we always need material for it. Please submit articles for it—if your article is printed, you will get a free table at the next show.

d. Vendors who help with the gun shows can get a free table; to be arranged with the gun show chairman, Garry Lodoen, or Warren Taylor.

e. The Sportsman's Show is coming up, and we will display our collection of Alaska commemoratives. See Roger Wakelam if you would like to help.
